Verse 1

*Anjana nandanam Veeram janaki soka nasanam,
Kapeesa Maksha hantharam, Vande lanka bhayangaram.*

Meaning: I salute the hero who is the son of Anjana, the destroyer of Mother Sita's sorrows. I bow to the King of Monkeys, the slayer of Aksha (son of Ravana), and the one who struck fear into the heart of Lanka.

Meaning: I bow my head and salute the messenger of Lord Rama. He who is as fast as the mind and the wind, who has mastered his senses, who is the wisest among the learned, the son of the Wind God, and the leader of the monkey army.

Verse 3

Anjaneya madhi patalananam, Kanchanadri kamaneeya vigraham,

Parijatha tharu moola vasinam, Bhavayami bhava mana nandanam.

Meaning: I meditate on the son of Anjana, whose face shines like the netherworld, whose body is as beautiful as a golden mountain. He dwells at the root of the celestial Parijata tree and is the darling son of the Wind God.

Verse 4

Yatra yatra Raghu nada keerthanam, Thathra thathra krudha masthakanjalim,

Bhashpa vari pari poorna lochanam, Maruthim namatha Rakshasanthakam.

Meaning: Wherever the glory of Lord Rama is sung, there stands Hanuman with his head bowed and eyes filled with tears of devotion. I salute Maruti, the destroyer of demons.

Budhir balam yaso dhairyam nirbhayathwam arokadha,

Ajadyam vak paduthwancha hanumath smaranath bhaveth.

The Result Meaning (Phala Sruthi): By remembering Lord Hanuman, one is blessed with intelligence, physical strength, fame, courage, fearlessness, health, alertness, and eloquence in speech.
